

His research has been on the introduction of the intersectionality of gender and other cultural identities into the online university, Gender and Communication class, with intersectionality including ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, and differently-abled. Larry worked directly with students for many years who are registered with ASU's Disability Resources Center (DRC) and was honored to receive in 2015 from Teacher Educators for Children with Behavioral Disorders the 2015 Robert B.
